The following Commission and instructions were issued to James, H. Jeffers.

The State of Maryland to James, H. Jeffers. Greeting.

Be it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence and honesty, I, Thomas King Carroll Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you my agent to receive from the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania the bodies of Abraham Poleak, and George Wilson fugitives from the justice of this State; and I do hereby authorize and direct you on receiving the said fugitives to bring them into this State, and convey and deliver them, to the warden of Baltimore County Jail, to receive an answer for shooting at with intent to kill a certain Deputy Keeper of the Penitentiary.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State of Maryland this third day of May 1830 and of the Independence of the United States the fifty fourth.
