

The account of William A. Miller amounting to Twenty two dollars, for publishing laws for Improvement of Shell Fish & preservation of Oysters, was examined and paid.

The account of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf and Dumb to first of April 1830, amounting to \$1102.22, was examined & paid.

Ordered that the Attorney, have the steps of the Land office, the Judges desk, and the window facings in the Court of Appeals chamber repaired, and purchase a new set of Chairs for the Judges of the Court of Appeals.

The account of James E. Miller for a new table, and set of seven chairs for the Council Chamber, amounting to eighty dollars, was examined & paid.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council, pay to the persons authorized to receive it, (thereward offered by the Directors of the Penitentiary for apprehending the persons, who on the 32<sup>d</sup> January 1830, assaulted the Deputy Keeper of the Penitentiary,) by a draft on the Treasurer of the Western Shore for Five hundred dollars.

The Executive then adjourned to meet on the 14<sup>th</sup> July next.

On the application of the Directors of the Penitentiary, the following demand was made.

The State of Maryland. v. r. f.

Whereas it has been represented to me, by the Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, that John Riddle, who was convicted in the Court of Stafford County on the 26<sup>th</sup> March last of "Assaulting James Disney with intent to commit murder, and sentenced to ten years confinement in the Penitentiary, escaped on the night of the 3<sup>rd</sup> inst; and that he has since been arrested in the District of Columbia.

Now therefore, I Thomas Ting Carroll, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby direct that the said John Riddle be delivered to Joseph Owen the Keeper of the Penitentiary, or to such person as shall be authorized by him to receive the said John Riddle in order that he may be returned to the Penitentiary from which he has escaped.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State of Maryland, and the twenty second day of April 1830, and after the Independence Day of the United States the fifty fourth.
