Magazine, due the 3<sup>rd</sup> inst.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to  
Mary Mackey presented at March Term 1828 by Harford County  
Court for selling half a pint of Whiskey without license. (see pardon record)

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the  
order of William McParlin, Three dollars, for repairing the clock at the  
Government House.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the  
order of John S. Zieber, Editor of the Village Herald, Twenty five dollars  
fifty Cents, viz<sup>t</sup> \$23. for publishing Laws for the Improvement of Shell  
fish for the preservation of Oysters, and \$2.50. for subscription to his  
paper to 9<sup>th</sup> Feby. 1831.

May 15<sup>th</sup>.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order  
of James E. Miller, Eighty dollars, for furniture for the Council Chamber  
as per his account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order  
of James H. Jeffers, Charles Brown, John Stewart, Henry Hoff,  
and William Crumbie for apprehending the persons, who appeared  
with intent to kill the Deputy Keeper of the Penitentiary on the  
night of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup> ulto. &c. This reward was offered by the  
Directors of the Penitentiary & paid by the order of the Governor on  
Council paper 3<sup>rd</sup> May.
