

May 15th 1830.

William P. Tate, and Robert, D. A. Tate, whose proposals for delivering the Laws, Votes & Proceedings &c. of the last Session of the Legislature to the County Clerks, having neglected to give bond as directed by the Resolution of the said Session and the time limited by said Resolution having nearly expired, Gedion Pearce of the City of Annapolis, was appointed in their stead on the same terms; who gave immediately the bond required with approved security, and received the Laws, Votes and Proceedings &c. for delivery.

May 17th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of Elizabeth Simions, Thirteen dollars and fifty Cents, for six months salary, for cleaning the Public temple, near the P^hice?

May 20th

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a Stolle Prosequio to Thomas Bond, of Talbot County, who was indicted at November Term 1829, of Talbot County Court, for a Rape on Eve Wadenhoof. (See pardon Record)

May 21.

His Excellency The Governor, this day granted a pardon to Theodore, B. Deuny, (a negro) convicted at Baltimore City Court at November Term 1829, of assaulting and beating Frederick Jensefield. (See pardon Record)

May 26.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of George Keatinge, Editor of the Snow Hill Messenger, Thirty dollars, for publishing Laws for preservation of Oysters, and Improvement of Oysters: (payable to R. & J. Smith by order)

May 31.

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a pardon to David Bennett, convicted at May Term 1830 of Frederick County, of purchasing a servant Anelia entitled to freedom after a Term of years for a new resident purchase of slaves, for transportation out of the State.
