The compensation of Josiah Wrayly Deputy Attorney for Worcester County, referred to the Executive by Resolution at 67. paid at December Session 1828. as a fine at One Hundred dollars.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Moses Sheppard, Four hundred and twenty five dollars for six months interest on \$17,000. Tobacco & 1/2 Cent Loan. > due 1st inst.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of William White, President of the Pennsylvania Asylum for the deaf and dumb, Eleven hundred and two dollars and twenty two Cents, for the expenses of the pupils from this State to the first of April 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order of Peter Ford Editor of the National Journal, nine dollars thirty three and 1/2 Cts. for subscriptions to daily paper from March 5 1829 to July 2. 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order of Henry S. Anderson Editor of the Baltimore Republican, Twenty five dollars, it being the amount of his account to March 19th 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order of Henry Boutwell, fifty Cents, for Black sand furnished this Office.

The Executive then adjourned to the third Wednesday, in October.
