

July 24th 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Joseph Sands, six dollars for three days attendance in making an Inventory and appraisement of furniture in the Government House.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of William Pope, Four dollars for two days attendance in making Inventory and appraisement of furniture in the Government House.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the order of Jonas Green, Fifty three dollars, viz^t For printing for State Library \$3.00. For printing for Adjutant General, \$10. and for printing for the Executive, \$40.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of William Pope, Ten dollars, for repairs done in the Council Chamber.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of Jonathan Hutton, Four hundred and twenty seven dollars, and Eighty six cents, \$427.86 for repairs of the State House, and forty two dollars, 62 1/2 cents for firing salutes and repairing gun Carriages as per his account allowed and paid.

July 26th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Josiah Bayly Esq^r Deputy Attorney General for Worcester County, One hundred dollars, for compensation in conducting suits for the State in the County Court & Court of appeals, ag^t Lord Hazard & others, agreeably to Resolution N^o 67, passed at December Session 1828.

July 30th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Claude & Hammond, Twenty two dollars and fifty six cents, viz^t \$22.56 for Stationery for the Adjutant General, and \$19.37 for the Executive.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Henry Peiry, ninety three dollars, and seventy five cents, for three quarters interest on \$2500 of State 5% Tobacco Inspection Loan due the 1st inst.

August 9th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of Jonathan Needam, Ten dollars, the balance claimed for printing books for the transmission of the Laws &c for 1829.
