

August 13th 1820.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a *Warrant* prosecuted to Samuel Thompson of Baltimore City, for stealing sundry articles of wearing apparel, for which he was indicted at April Term 1820: (See pardon record)

August 18th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order of Henry Thompson, One Hundred and fifty one dollars, fifty six $\frac{1}{4}$ Cts. for the purchase & expenses of putting away thirty one $\frac{1}{4}$ Cords of Hickory wood.

August 19th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Henry Thompson, One dollar fifty Cents, for Stationary purchased for the Executive.

August 20th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Jonathan Hutton, Thirty one dollars and two Cents, for painting the Office of the Register Land Office.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show, pay to the order of James, E. Miller, Two dollars and twenty two Cents, for Boards to secure papers for the use of the Executive.

September 3rd

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Isaac Munroe, Editor of the Baltimore Patriot, Eighteen dollars & fifty Cents, for various advertisements published in his paper in the year Eighteen hundred & twenty nine by order of the late Executive.

September 4th

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Zachariah Duvall, forty three dollars seventy Cents, for purchase and expenses of putting away nine and a half Cords of Hickory wood for the use of the State.

(Omitted, August 20th)

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Show pay to the order of Lewis and John O'Donnell, nine thousand, five hundred and seventy nine and seventeen Cents, for Interest & principals due on their Certificate of State 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ Cts. Tobacco Inspectors License also 21. Sept. 1820.
