

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to the order of James Murray Clerk to the Council, Three Hundred and twenty Five dollars for one quarters salary due the 1st. inst. 1830

October 7<sup>th</sup> 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of William White, President of the Pennsylvania Institution for the deaf and dumb, eleven hundred and eighty seven dollars and fifty Cents, for six months tuition of sixteen pupils (2. for 154 days) as per his draft favour of John Bacon, and accounts examined & approved.

His Excellency the Governor this day made the following demand.

To His Excellency David Hazards Governor of the State of Delaware.

Whereas a certain Jacob Kling stands charged by a certain Thomas Ricketts, of Cecil County in the State of Maryland, of having stolen from his stable, a Horse found in the possession of the said Jacob Kling in the State of Delaware.

And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Jacob Kling has fled from justice and is now in the State of Delaware. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of society, that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice. Now therefore I, Thomas King Canole, Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me, by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said Jacob Kling, as a fugitive from the justice of this State; and make known to your Excellency that I have appointed John Miller my agent to receive the said fugitive and bring him to this State, having jurisdiction of the said offence, that he may be brought to trial therefor.

In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I have with annex, and produced to your Excellency a copy of the affidavits, upon which this demand is founded: which I certify is authentic.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State of Maryland this fourteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & thirty and of the Independence of the United States the fifty fifth.
