

This Evening the Governor this day granted a pardon to William H. Anderson who was convicted by Baltimore City Court at November Term 1828 of Felony and sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary. (see pardon record)

The Executive then adjourned to the 27<sup>th</sup> Decr. 1830. >

October 22<sup>nd</sup> 1830. >

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of Charles P. Bouldin, Editor of the Maryland Republican, Twelve dollars, for advertising proposals for public printing, and laws passed at December Session 1829, proposing changes in the Constitution, as per acct allowed

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of John Hobb, nine dollars, for carting material, for repairs of public buildings, as per account allowed

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of William Earle and Henry Boultin, Twenty six dollars 18<sup>3/4</sup> Cts, for labor in repairs of public buildings as per account allowed

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of John S. Gibson, Editor of the Village Herald, twelve dollars, for publishing the Laws of the last Session of the Legislature, proposing changes in the Constitution, as per account allowed

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of John E. Kelly, Thomas King, Auditor, Governor, six hundred and sixty six dollars, and sixty six Cents, for one quarters salary due the first inst.

October 23<sup>rd</sup> 1830.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of Claude Hammond sixteen dollars, 48<sup>3/4</sup> Cts, viz: \$12, for Stationery for the Executive, & \$4.48<sup>3/4</sup> for the Adjutant General, as per acct allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of Henry Thompson, Fifteen dollars, Fifteen & 1/2 Cts, for amount of borrowing (heretofore suspended by Clerk of the Council) on \$151.56<sup>3/4</sup> for purchase of firewood; July 31, 1830. >

October 12 (omitted)

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of Jonas Frew Postmaster at Annapolis, sixty dollars ninety five Cents, for one quarters postage to 1<sup>st</sup> inst. viz: \$56.18, for the Executive & \$4.77 for the Treasurer.

October 23<sup>rd</sup>

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western should pay to the order of Daniel Clark, Eighty one dollars, 15 Cts; \$56.15, for binding books for
