November 5th 1820

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the
order of the Hon R. J. D. G. Wright a member of the Executive Council
One hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary due
the first of October last.

November 8th.

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a pardon to Peter Devins
convicted on Indictment in Montgomery County Court at March
Term 1820, of Felony, and sentenced to two years confinement in the
Penitentiary. (See pardon record)

Also a pardon to Joshua Mitchell convicted on Indictment in
Baltimore City Court at November Term 1820 of feloniously stea-
-ling articles of the value of \$19.50. and sentenced to five years con-
-finement in the Penitentiary. (See pardon record)

November 10th.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of
Moses Sheppard, Four thousand, Two hundred and thirty four dollars
and seventy two Cents, in part payment of his Certificate for \$17,000.
State Sp. Ct. Tobacco Inspection Loan, including interest to first
of October last on \$17,000. and on \$4,000. principal now advanced
to this day inclusive.

November 12th.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order
of James Mills, Thirty dollars, for six months rent of magazine
ending the 3rd inst.

November 15th.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order
of Elizabeth Simmons, thirteen dollars, fifty Cents, for cleaning the
public temple to first inst.

November 16th.

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a nolle Prosequi
to Seth Wilkins, presented by the grand Jury for the body of Som-
-erset County at May Term 1820, for Forging. (See pardon record)
Commission issued to Samuel Hoffman as Auctioneer for the City of Baltimore.

November 23rd.

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a pardon to Henry D
Bailey, convicted by Dorchester County Court at October Term 1820
of stealing a watch, and sentenced to two years confinement in the
Penitentiary. (See pardon record).

a pardon to William Horn, convicted at Baltimore City Court of receiving stolen goods
