His Excellency the Governor this day made the following demand on the Governor of Pennsylvania. >

To His Excellency George Wolf, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania.

Whereas a certain John Hicks stands charged by the affidavit of George Arnold taken before Andrew Bodew Esq. a Justice of the peace for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania of having committed a highway robbery sometime in the year 1824, on the said Arnold in Harford County in the State of Maryland.

And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said John Hicks, has fled from justice and is now confined in the Jail of Cumberland County Pennsylvania. > And it being important and highly necessary for the good of society that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to justice: Now therefore I, Thomas King Carroll Governor of the State of Maryland by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said John Hicks as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency that I have appointed John Spangler of Carlisle in the State of Pennsylvania my agent to recover the said fugitive, and bring him to this State, having jurisdiction of the said offence, that he may be brought to trial therefor. >

In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I herewith enclose and produce to your Excellency a Copy of the affidavit upon which this demand is founded which I certify is authentic.
