The following warrant was issued to James M. Jeffers, Secretary  
of the State of Maryland, in James M. Jeffers Treating -

Be it known that reposing great trust and confidence  
in your prudence and honesty, I Thomas King Carroll, Govern  
or of the State of Maryland have appointed you my agent  
to receive from the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania,  
John Charles Dault, Robert Ormsby and Lewis Hol  
comb, fugitives from the justice of this State; and I  
do hereby authorize and direct you upon receiving the said  
fugitives, to bring them into this State and convey and deliver  
them to the warden of Baltimore County Jail to answer for  
the crimes alleged against them by the presentments of the  
grand jury for the City of Baltimore.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the  
State of Maryland this first week day of Decem  
ber in the year of our Lord One thousand eight  
hundred thirty, and of the Independence of the United  
States, the fifth fifth.
