His Excellency The Governor granted a pardon to John Salter, convicted at November Term 1822 by Baltimore City Court of Felony, and sentenced to Ten years Confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record.)

His Excellency The Governor this day granted a pardon to John Hitchcock, convicted at August Term 1830, of Harford County Court of Felony; (See pardon record)

His Excellency The Governor also granted a pardon to William Nichols, convicted at December Term 1830, of Frederick County Court of stealing property to the value of Three dollars, and sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary. (See pardon record)

His Excellency The Governor this day also granted a pardon to James Daily convicted at November Term 1830 of Baltimore City Court of assaulting and beating James Hickey, John Muckle and James Lynn, and sentenced to six months confinement in Baltimore County Jail. (See pardon record)

A Joint Committee of both Branches of the Legislature waited on His Excellency The Governor in the Council Chamber and informed him of the organization of both Branches, who were prepared to receive any communication he might think proper to make them.)
