

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Lewis Gapaway, Chief Clerk to the Senate, Thirty seven dollars fifty Cents for one quarter salary due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Henry Thompson all pay due to the Executive, One hundred dollars for one quarter salary due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Jonathan Hutton Arnold at Annapolis, Eighty eight dollars seventy four Cents for repairs of public buildings, as per his account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of James Murray Clerk of the Council, Three hundred and seventy five dollars for one quarter salary due this day.

January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1831.

This being the day prescribed by the Constitution for the election of Governor, His Excellency, Daniel Martin, was on the joint ballot of both Branches of the Legislature, elected to that Office, for the ensuing year.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of Adam and John Miller, Five dollars and fifty cents viz: \$5 for one ream of paper for the Executive, and fifty Cents for freight of two boxes for the Executive from New York.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay to the order of William Brown of Bow Examining General of the Western Shore, One hundred and seventy four dollars twenty three Cents for one quarter salary, due the first instant after deducting the fees received by him.

January 4<sup>th</sup> 1831.

This being the day prescribed by the Constitution for the election of a Council to the Governor, George Howard, Esq (of John Eager) of Anne Arundel County, Thomas C. Worthington Esquire of Frederick's County, Samuel Turner Esquire of Calvert County, Henry Page Esquire of Dorchester County and General, William Potter of Caroline County, were on the Joint ballot of both Branches of the Legislature, duly elected a Council to the Governor for the ensuing year.
