for trial for the said offence. — Now, therefore I Daniel Martin,  
Governor of the State of Maryland, did thought proper, in compliance  
with the said Demand to General Duvall, to surrender the said fugitives;  
and I do hereby bid and direct the said Duvall to deliver the said  
fugitives to the said Blaney and Millman agents aforesaid; they the said  
agents first paying all costs of the arrest and detention of the said fugitives. —  
For all which this shall be your sufficient warrant.

Whereas in compliance with a Demand  
of His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania,  
writs have been issued for the surrender of John Simpson, John Shuson  
and John Ross, alias William Shuson, fugitives from the Justice of the  
said State to the said H. Blaney and John Millman, agents duly appointed  
to receive the said fugitives and transport them to the said State of Pennsylvania,  
it appearing from authentic documents transmitted to the Executive Depart-  
ment of the said State, that the said John Simpson, John Shuson and  
John Ross, alias William Shuson, stand charged on the Oath of Henry  
S. Smith, with having committed a robbery in the City of Philadelphia,  
in the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and that they have fled from  
the Justice of the said State, and are now confined in Jail in the City  
of Baltimore. — Now, therefore I Daniel Martin,  
Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and  
enjoin all persons within this State to let the said Blaney and Millman  
agents aforesaid, pass with the said fugitives, unobstructed to the said  
State of Pennsylvania: they the said agents, conducting themselves in  
a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper severity or  
cruelty in their treatment of the said prisoners.
