

in Baltimore County Court, on the eighteenth day of November 1829; and sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Journal Record)

By the petition of Hugh Suffy, in a transcript from the records of Baltimore City Court, it appears that the said Hugh Suffy, was fined by the said Court, at November Term 1830, the sum of twenty dollars for assaulting and beating James Keegan, John Muckle and James Lynn; also the sum of twenty dollars for assaulting and beating James Keegan; and also the sum of twenty dollars for assaulting and beating John Muckle.

The petition states that until this juvenile indiscretion he had sustained an irreproachable character; that this is the first and only charge ever preferred against him; that he is a young man entirely destitute without the means of paying the fine inflicted, and without friends able to assist him. He therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And several of the Jurors who found the said Hugh Suffy guilty of the aforesaid offences, and among these respectable citizens of the City of Baltimore having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, and it appearing that he has suffered a considerable term of imprisonment, upon consideration of his case, we do hereby remit the aforesaid fine.
