Robert McCall brought before the Court of Calvert County, Henry Adams Esquire, of the City of Baltimore, and James Boyd Esquire, of the City of Annapolis, Commissioners to repair to Maryland, to demonstrate against the conduct of Pennsylvania in erecting artificial obstructions to the navigation of the Chesapeake Bay, and to endeavor to procure the removal of all such obstructions, in virtue of a Resolution passed at the present Session of the General Assembly.

By the petition of Thomas McCall, and a transcript from the records of Allegany County Court, it appears that the said Thomas McCall was fined by the said Court, at October term 1830, the sum of fifty dollars for selling Dry goods, without License. The Petitioner states that he commenced retailing Dry goods in Frostburg, Allegany County, sometime about the month of March 1830, that previously to transacting any business he employed a friend to go to Cumberland to procure for him a License as required by Law, that said friend did, accordingly, go to Cumberland and spoke to another gentleman to procure the License, and in his return to Frostburg, informed the petitioner that he had a permit to sell at the County Court, and that the License could be procured at Court; that at the next Court, he did get a License, and to his very great surprise, he was afterwards informed that no permit had been issued. The petitioner avers that he had no intention of violating the Law, and therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And the said Court, having received a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, upon consideration of his case, and do hereby remit so much of the aforesaid fine, as is payable to the State. By the petition of Thomas McCall, it appears that he was fined by Allegany County Court, at Spring term 1831, the sum of thirty two dollars for selling Dry goods, without License.
