

Fishes upon the River

The Petition states that since he was sent to the Bishop or  
was applied to Mr. William Bryan his neighbor who was in his  
way to the King's office in time of day and requested the said William  
to grant to procure a license for him to sell spiritual liquors at the said Fishes  
that having no doubt but that the license had been obtained by the said Bryan,  
he proceeded to sell and thereby laid himself liable to the aforesaid fines. He  
states that nothing is further from his intention than in any manner to make  
himself punishable to or to commit any breach of the Law. He therefore  
prays for a remission of the said fines and the said Court, having recom-  
mended a remission of the said fines except the price of one License for selling  
spiritual liquors and fishing, had in a few considerations of the case of the said  
Petitioner and hereby remitted the said fines except the price of said  
Fishing License.

By the Petition of William E. Bond and a transcript from the  
records of the County Court appearing that the said William E. Bond was  
fined by the said Court at October term 1830 in three several cases, the  
sum of fifty dollars in each case for selling Oysters without License.

The Petitioner states that at the time when the said offences  
were committed he had a License to sell Dry goods &c. which was signed  
to him by the Clerk in the name of a License to sell and Oyster. As he for  
some time applied and which he thought he had, that he never was a  
retailer of Dry goods and did not receive the said License, but only  
to sell Oysters and spiritual liquors; that he was utterly ignorant  
of the difference in the nature of the two Licenses; and being that  
it was not his intention to violate the Law or evade the payment of the tax,  
that he is now old and poor with a large family to support and unable  
to release himself from said fines must remain in Jail without any means of  
being released. He therefore prays for a remission of the said fines and the  
said Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the Petitioner  
upon consideration hereby remitted the said fines, except the price of  
one License payable to the State.
