William R. Stewart's bond for the faithful performance of his duties, as one of the Commissioners of Lotteries, was laid before the board, and examined, and the securities being considered sufficient, was approved.

John S. Williams laid before the board a new bond, in lieu of the one approved the 17th Instant, for the faithful performance of his duties as one of the Commissioners of Lotteries, with a request that if accepted the other bond may be cancelled, which said new bond, being examined, and the securities considered sufficient (they were the same in both bonds) was approved, and the first bond cancelled. (Note this transaction was in consequence of its being ascertained that the penalty of the first bond, was not that prescribed by Law.)

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one hundred dollars for the purchase of fireworks, this account for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one dollar seventy five cents for Fines for the General Chamber of Account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James Ishart or order six dollars viz \$4.50 for Paper, 80 cents for Fueling and 20 cents for Candles for the creation of Account allowed.
