The Council met Present the same as yesterday

On the Nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, John Mercer Esquire, of Anne Arundel County, was appointed one of the Commissioners, to repair to Harrisburg to remonstrate against the conduct of Pennsylvania, in erecting artificial obstructions to the navigation of the River Susquehanna, and to endeavor to procure the removal of all such obstructions, vice James Boyle Esquire, who declines the appointment.

Ordered that the Clerk draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore for one hundred and fifty dollars for the Commission to Harrisburg, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Robert H. S. S. Esquire, a sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, on account of his Mission to Harrisburg, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Barrett Esquire, a sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, on account of his Mission to Harrisburg, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Mercer Esquire a sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, on account of his Mission to Harrisburg, to be accounted for.
