His Excellency the Governor this day granted a pardon to Sarah Martin negro, on account of stealing two blankets of the value of four dollars, of which she was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1831, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. The following Demand was made upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, for the person therein mentioned, as a fugitive from Justice, upon application, and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in this Department. Viz

To His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, Whereas certain Robert Drusby, late of the City of Baltimore, yeoman, stands charged by the Jurors of the State of Maryland for the City of Baltimore, with having feloniously stolen, and boat of the said John Skinner. And Whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Robert Drusby has fled from jail and is now confined in jail in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of society that the perpetrators of such offenses should be brought to justice. Now therefore, I Daniel Martin Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution
