reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence and honesty, I
Samuel Martin Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you
my agents to receive from His Excellency the Governor of the State of
Pennsylvania, the body of Robert Crumby, a fugitive from the Justice
of this State, and I do hereby authorize and direct you upon receiving
the said fugitive, to bring him into this State, and convey and deliver
him to the Warden of Baltimore County Jail, to answer for stealing
a boat of the value of fourteen dollars current money, on the sixth
day of September 1830.
