

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Tiering Lewis, President of the Mutual Association of Baltimore, or order, thirty two dollar twenty five cents, for interest from the first of July 1829 to the 31 January 1831, upon a Certificate of stock held by him, as amount to the purchase money of Tobacco Warehouse and Lots.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George J. Brewer, ~~Esquire~~ Register of the Land Office for the Western Shore, or his order, thirty dollar for lists of certificates ready for patent to be sent to the Commissioners of the Tax for the Federal Counties, on the Western Shore.

March 24 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order, forty six dollar fifty two cents for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Miss J. Myer or order, four hundred and forty eight dollar seven cents for one year ground Rent up to the fifteenth day of August next at the Tobacco Warehouse and Lot purchased for the State of a Mrs. Sheppard.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Benjamin Leppitt, a Defendant of Stealing, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court on the 26th day of February 1823, and for which he was sentenced to ten years confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also this day granted a Pardon to William Thompson, an amount of Felony, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court on the second day of July 1825, and for which he was sentenced to six year confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record)

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Cuff Green or order ten dollar for the United States Telegraph for one year to the first Instant.

March 31 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order about nine dollar seventy cents, for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to John Smith, on account of entering a Slave's man away - for which he was convicted in Montgomery County Court, at a habeas corpus, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and for which he was sentenced to ten year confinement in the Penitentiary.
