

Upon the surrender this day, by Doct^r William Sappington,
of Harford County, of a certificate of \$7500000 issued in the name of
Amelia Lane & Company, with whom the said Doct^r Sappington by intermarriage
for \$140000 amount to the purchase money of Toms Warehouse Ware-
house, a new certificate for the same sum was issued in the name of the
said Doct^r William Sappington to bear interest from the first instant.

April 12th 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to
Miss Jacob Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf
and Dumb a bill or order, not to exceed two hundred and ninety dollars
fifty cents, for the support, tuition and clothing of twenty indigent
Deaf and Dumb pupils from this State, for the last six months, ending
the first instant, as of account.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Lewis
Keth or order thirty two dollars twelve and a half cents, for one
quarter interest due the first instant, upon a certificate of stock held
by him on account of the purchase money of Evans Warehouse and
Co.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
Mrs Anne Leach or order forty dollars, for one quarter pension,
due the first instant.
