John G. ... of the Justice of the Peace Court of Frederick County was
granted leave to resign and Thomas Spriner, additional Justice of the Peace
under the last in consequence of a new district having been laid off and
an act of Assembly requiring the appointment of a member of the said Court
for said district.

Joseph ... a Notary Public to reside at Frederick Town, Md.
Madison ... resigned.

Henry G. ... additional Justice of the Peace of Washington
County.

William, Walter, Edward, Richard, & ... and
Thomas ... additional Justices of the Peace of Baltimore County.

Henry & ... of Anne Arundel County
Thomas ... of Anne Arundel County and John B. ...
James ... of Baltimore County. Concerning the limits of
direct taxation within the City of Baltimore, to find if the same is
settled better improved and in which the usual regulations for watching
and lighting & cleaning the streets are or ought to be applied, as
provided by an act passed at the last Session of the General Assembly
entitled "An additional act relating to the City of Baltimore".

By the petition of John ... and Rachel ... and a
transcript from the records of Anne Arundel County, it appears that
they had sometime previous to October Term of the said Court in the year
1830, entered into recognizance in the sum of ten dollars for the appearance
of said Peter ... before the said Court to answer for felony and that
the said recognizance was afterwards forfeited.

The petitioners represent that the said Peter ... had
been committed to jail charged with having stolen ... that a short
time after his confinement his situation (which was) became so
alarming to the jailer that he directed them to become security for the
appearance of the said Peter ... at home that they released his securities,
accordingly and procured an Order from the Justice of the Peace and for him
to be ... of the County where he resided and from whence he
absconded in consequence of which the aforesaid recognizance was forfeited.

The petitioners pray that under these circumstances the said
forfeiture may be remitted. And the said Court having recommended
to comply with their prayer we do hereby remit the aforesaid forfeiture.
