

The Treasurer of the Western Shore, having, in compliance with the direction of the act of December Session 1830, chapter 119, asked the consent and advice of the Governor and Council, as to the mode of payment of the States' subscription to the stock of the Baltimore and Annapolis Railroad Company authorized by the said act, and having expressed his own opinion in favor of the said payment being made by the issue of stock in favor of said company bearing interest at the rate of Four and a half per centum per annum, twelve months after each respective issue may be required, it was Resolved that the Governor and Council, do consent and advise that the said payments be made as proposed by the Treasurer.

Ordered that the Adjutant General be directed in obtaining the arms due from the United States, to procure two hundred rifles, in part thereof and the residue in muskets.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay, to the Rev. Daniel C. Dyer one hundred and fifty dollars for making two copies of the plot of the public lands, situate near of Fort Cumberland, under contract with the executor, by virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a pardon to James Nicholas on account of breaking and entering the dwelling house of Isaac Newey, in the night of the seventeenth day of March 1825, and stealing therefrom sundry Bank notes and other valuable articles, the goods and chattels of the said Isaac Newey, ^{which he was convicted in Superior Court, and paid a fine of \$100 on the 14th of August 1825} and for which the said Nicholas was sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for five years. His Excellency also this day granted a pardon to Henry Young on account of "Felonious" of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1831. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also this day granted a pardon to Suskey Jenkins, on account of "Felonious" of which she was convicted, in Baltimore City Court, on the 26th day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also this day granted a pardon to Alexander Simpson, on account of a charge of feloniously stealing from the Store of Simon Goddard in the City of Baltimore, on or about the first of March last, twenty Pen Knives of various patterns, and for which he had been committed to the Jail of Baltimore County, by James Allison Esquire, a Justice of the Peace for the City of Baltimore.
