

April 21st 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Gale and Eaton or order ten dollars for the Quincy National Intelligence from the 6th of March 1831 to the 6th of March 1832 amount

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George W. Thomas Trustee for Hiramsville, No. 100, or order eighty dollars for six months interest due to the first Assistant upon certificate of stock for \$3200 held by him on account of the purchase money of Tobacco Warehouses and Lots.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Levin Nothred or order sixty two dollars fifty cents for six months interest due to the first Assistant upon certificate of stock for \$2500 held by him on account of the purchase money of Tobacco Warehouses and Lots.

April 23rd 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas & Washington or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary of a member of the Council due to the first Assistant.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to John Chafer in account of receiving stolen Turkeys, of which he was convicted in June & Grand County Court at April Term 1831, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Journal Record)

May 4th 1831.

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to James Meeson, in account of keeping a disorderly House, of which he had been convicted in June & Grand County Court, at April Term 1831, and for which he was sentenced to thirty days confinement in the public goal of said County.
