

at Orléans, to yield & prompt obedience to the Laws of the Land, the said left-
 Battalion promptly, at the time required by the Attorney General, but having,
 in a timely manner, taken a land conveyance instead of the steam Boat, he did not arrive
 until the following morning of the day of trial, & his recognizance was forfeited,
 and he is now called upon to pay to the State the sum of two hundred dollars,
 for a supposed disobedience to the orders of the Court, for which he declares his
 entire innocence. He then prays for remission of the said forfeiture.
 And the said Court, having received & complied with the prayer of
 the said petitioner, we do here by remission of the said forfeiture.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Nancy
 Purcell Negro, on account of stealing a Cart load of Hay of the value of
 twenty five cents, of which she was convicted in Worcester County Court, at
 May Term 1831, and for which she was sentenced to be imprisoned for
