

By the petition of Henry Childs and a transcript from the Record of Charles County Court it appears that the said Henry Childs and a widow Stone street had entered into a recognizance in the sum of one hundred dollars jointly and severally, in the appearance of the said Henry Childs before the said County Court at March term 1830 and that the said recognizance has since been forfeited. The petitioner states that the said recognizance was not forfeited from any fear of the consequences or a wish to evade the Law but from inability to attend the Court in consequence of severe indisposition in George Stone; that he is innocent and has no intention to violate the Laws of the Land, that he is poor and but illly able to pay the penalty and throws himself upon the clemency of the Executive, trusting that under the recommendation of the Court who are acquainted with the parties & circumstances that a remission of said forfeited recognizance will be granted. And the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner we do hereby remit the said forfeiture.

By the petition of Noah Pilgiman, and a transcript from the Record of Charles County Court it appears that he was fined by the said Court at P. Mag. term 1831, the sum of fifty dollars for selling dry goods without a License. The petitioner states that a certain Jacob Riggins was a retailer of Merchandise in Salisbury, Somerset County, and a License as prescribed by Law, that he purchased of the said Jacob Riggins and took an assignment of his License, and went on to sell as the said Jacob had done, believing that an act had been passed authorizing such assignment and that such was the general impression in Salisbury. That he had no intention to defraud the revenue of the State and is willing to pay the sum of six dollars which would have been the sum the State would have received had he not been under the impression he did, and he therefore prays for a remission of the said fine except the said six dollars. And the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner we do hereby remit the said fine, to pay as the Law is payable to the State, except the sum of six dollars.
