

Sept 1830, for furniture and repairs of the Government House.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one hundred and sixty dollars five cents for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

August 26th 1831.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to John alias Mulford Harding, in amount of Stealing, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, on the 24th of November 1830, and for which he was sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record).

August 29th 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James Mills or order fifteen dollars for one quarter Rent of Magazine, due the 3<sup>d</sup> Instant.

September 2nd 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one hundred and six dollars fifteen cents, for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

September 9th 1831.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to a certain Bartholomew T. Fowler, on amount of an assault & battery on a certain John Lizer which caused his death, committed in Frederick County on the 25th day of June 1831. See Pardon Record.

September 10th 1831.

The following demand was made upon the Honorable William Branch Chief Justice of the Circuit Court of the District of Columbia for the period therein named as a fugitive from Justice, upon application and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in this Department. viz

To the Honorable William Branch Chief Justice of the Circuit Court of the District of Columbia. Whereas a certain John Corn hath been charged by affidavit of a certain Richard Dawson with having feloniously stolen and taken from the said Richard Dawson, on or about the twenty fifth day of August last, in the City of Baltimore, the sum of two hundred and seventy dollars in Bank Notes, and a gold watch and where as information has been received at the Executive Department of this State that the said John Corn hath fled from justice and is now confined in Jail in the City of Washington and that he has confessed the said theft. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society, that the perpetrator of such offenses should be brought to Justice. Now therefore George A. Conrad Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me and Constitution and Laws of the United States do hereby demand
