His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Ann Creston on account of an assault with intent to kill, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court on the 17th day of February 1825, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for twenty five years.

Tuesday September 20th 1831.

His Excellency the Governor and the Honorable Henry Page of the Council attended this day.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James J. Booth or order twelve dollars fifty cents for six months interest due the first of July last upon a certificate of stock for \$500 held by him on account of the purchase money of Tobias Warehouse and Lots.

His Excellency the Governor this granted the following Pardon in the several places and for the several and respective offenses mentioned, viz;

To James A. Lee on account of beating of which he was convicted in Frederick County Court and sentenced on the 20th of November 1829 to the Penitentiary for three years.

To James C. Adams on account of beating of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court and for which he was sentenced, on the 25th day of February 1827 to temporary confinement in the Penitentiary.

To Henry M. Johnson on account of beating of which he was convicted in Washington County Court on the 7th day of April 1820, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years.

To Edward C. Adams on account of murder in the second degree; of which he was convicted in Talbot County Court on the 29th day of November
