To Samuel Thomas, on account of a charge of stealing a fine from Mrs Hart which was pending against him, and for which he was by recognizance to appear and answer, before Baltimore County Court, on the first Monday of November next.

To Eleanor Shipley, on account of a charge of having committed an assault & battery on the body of Levi Chaney, which was pending against her by indictment in & in the Circuit & Grand County Court.
