

October 20th 1831

His Excellency the Governor attended this day in the Council Chamber

Casper W. Moser, John L. Harding and Christian Kemp Esquires, who were appointed by His Excellency the Governor on the first day of August last to view and examine five continuous miles of the Fredericks and Harpers Ferry Turnpike Road, which the President and Managers of the Company incorporated to improve had reported to have been made in a workmanlike manner, according to Law, and to report to him in writing the result of their examination, having reported that the aforesaid five continuous miles of the said Road has been completed, according to Law a License under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, and the great Seal of the State, was issued to the said President and Managers authorizing them to receive the several Acts for paving on said Road, allowed by Law

October 25 1831.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Benjamin Watson, on account of a charge of beating two pair of Shoes and sundry articles of Shoemaker tools, the property of Sims Hooker and Robert Shipley which was pending against by commitment to the Jail of Baltimore County, by Beale C. Hutchinson, a Justice of the Peace of said County.

November 8th 1831.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Turner Esquire of sides one hundred and twenty five dollars for one months salary as a member of the Council, due the first return.

November 10th 1831.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay His Excellency George Howard, of sides five hundred and eleven dollars and ten cents for his salary as Governor, from the 22nd of July last to the 5th return.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Edward Carter on account of a charge of Murder, pending against him in Caroline County Court. (See Pardon Record)

Nov 11 1831.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Samuel Thompson Negro on account of beating, which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at Peters Term last. (See Pardon Record)
