Returns having been received from the several Congressional districts of the Election held on the 5th ultimo, for the Election of Members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, the board proceeded to enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person named for a member of Congress as aforesaid, when it appeared that, Daniel Simpson Esquire, in the first district, Benedict S. Emme Esquire, in the second district, George C. Worthington Esquire, in the third district, Francis Thomas Esquire, in the fourth district, Benjamin C. Howard and Mr. J. H. Worthington Esquires, in the fifth district, George E. Mitchell Esquire in the sixth district, John S. Kerr Esquire, in the seventh district, and Mrs. S. Spence Esquire in the eighth district, were duly elected members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States. Whereupon the following Proclamation was issued, as directed by Law. Whereas by an act of the general Assembly of this State, passed at a Session begun eighteen hundred and five, entitled "An act to amend into one the several acts of Assembly respecting Elections and to regulate said Elections," it is directed that the Governor and Council, after having received the returns of Elections of members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, shall enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as a member of Congress aforesaid, respectively, and shall thereupon declare by Proclamation, signed by the Governor, the name or names of the person or persons duly elected in each respective district.
