Conner, Esquire, in the first district; Benedict S. Skimmer, Esquire, in the second district; George B. Washington, Esquire, in the third district; Francis Thomas, Esquire, in the fourth district; Benjamin C. Conrad and John T. G. Washington, Esquires, in the fifth district; George E. Mitchell, Esquire, in the sixth district; John L. Kerr, Esquire, in the seventh district and John S. Stone, Esquire, in the eighth district, were duly elected members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States.
