The State of Maryland, tow^t. Whereas, in compliance with a demand of His Excellency George Wolf, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, orders have been given for the surrender of a certain Simon Eicholtz, as a fugitive from the Justice of the said State to Anthony Burns, agent, duly appointed to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania, it appearing from authentic documents transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, that the said Simon Eicholtz stands charged by indictment of a grand Jury of the City and County of Lancaster with having committed the crime of Manslaughter in the said County, and having fled from Justice has been apprehended, and is now confined in the Gaol of the City and County of Baltimore, in this State. Now, therefore, I George Howard, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State, to let the said Anthony Burns, agent as aforesaid, pass with the said fugitive unmolested to the said State of Pennsylvania. — let the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.
