

November 28, 1831.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a writ of habeas corpus to Thomas Edelin, on account of a charge of stealing, which was pending against him in Prince George's County Court. (See Journal record)

His Excellency also this day granted a writ on to George White, on account of Peter Lacey, with which he was charged in Montgomery County Court. (See Journal record)

December 5th 1831.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the State should pay William A. Murray or order, fourteen dollars forty nine cents for one quarter interest upon a certificate of stock for \$1150, held by him on account of the purchase money of Tobacco Warehouse and Lots.

The following demand was made upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of New York for the person therein named, as a fugitive from Justice, upon application, and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in this Department. Viz

To His Excellency Enos T. Hoop, Governor of the State of New York. Whereas a certain Bernard Watson, alias Jones, stands charged by the affidavit of a certain F. M. Lea, of the City of New Orleans, in the State of Louisiana, of having robbed the said F. M. Lea, in the early part of September last, at Barnum's Hotel in the City of Baltimore, of between seven and eight hundred dollars, and a gold watch. And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Bernard Watson, alias Jones, has fled from Justice, and is now confined in Jail in the City of New York. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society, that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice. Now, therefore, I George Howard Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said Bernard Watson, alias Jones, as a fugitive from Justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency that I have appointed George Riggs and James H. Jeffers, Constables of the City of Baltimore, my agents to receive the said fugitive and bring him to this State, having Jurisdiction of the said offence, and he may be brought to trial therefor.

In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I have annexed and produce to your Excellency a copy of the affidavit upon which this demand is founded, which I certify is authentic. Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this fifth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one.
