To John Parks, on account of stealing, for which he was convicted in Anne
County Court, at November Term 1829, and for which he was sentenced to ten years confinement
in the Penitentiary.

To William Barney, on account of Burglary, of which he was convicted
in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1823, and for which he was sentenced
to ten years confinement in the Penitentiary.

To Ebeneus Cooper, on account of Stealing, of which he was convicted
in Kent County Court, at September Term 1827, and for which he was sentenced
to ten years confinement in the Penitentiary.

To Samuel Hopkins, on account of Stealing, of which he was convicted
in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1830, and for which he was sentenced
to five years confinement in the Penitentiary.
