

At no distant day, Maryland will be highly distinguished for advancement in internal improvement. A thing will be wanted to secure the most triumphant success in her stupendous undertakings, but the requisite funds; and in a Country where public and private Treasures are, & all things, abundantly, devoted to enterprises of real utility, we have no occasion for fear on that head.

The Susquehanna Rail Road is progressing, and promises great benefits; but its ulterior success cannot be estimated until a charter is granted by the State of Pennsylvania, to that Company, on the furtherance of its objects.

You will herewith receive, the annual Report of the Directors of the Penitentiary, which has just been received, but which I have not had time to examine.

Herewith, submit communications from the respective Executives of several States, with Resolutions and other acts of the Legislatures of said States, upon a variety of Subjects of deep and general interest viz

From the Executive of Maine, a report and Resolutions, with accompanying documents, in relation to the North Eastern boundary of that State, and of the United States; and also, a report and resolutions, respecting the Tariff, and internal improvements by the General Government; in which strong disapprobation of both is expressed, and the Constitutional power to execute a System of, or to Legislate upon, the latter Subject, is explicitly, denied.

From the Executive of New Hampshire, a resolution in favour of a more perfect organization of the Militia of the several States, by the Congress of the United States.

From the Executive of Massachusetts, a Resolution similar to that above mentioned from New Hampshire; and also a preamble, and Resolutions, in relation to certain proceedings of the State of Georgia, and in approval and defence of the Judicial power of the Court of the United States.

From the Executive of Connecticut, a Report, and a Resolution, in accord with those of Massachusetts, in relation to the Judicial power of the Court of the United States.

From the Executive of Delaware, a Report, and a Resolution, departing from the respective Resolutions of the General Assemblies of Louisiana & Missouri, proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States, in relation to the election of President and Vice President; also, a Report and Resolutions, in relation to the Tariff, and internal improvements, in concurrence with the Legislature of Pennsylvania, that the Tariff of 1828, accords with the true spirit of the Constitution of the United States, and maintains the true principles of protection to the industry of the Country, against foreign policy and Legislation; and in concurrence with the General Assembly of the States of Louisiana & Vermont,
