

The State of Maryland to wit: Whereas, in compliance with a demand of His Excellency George Wolf's Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, 1802, have been given for the surrender of a certain Daniel Klapp, a fugitive from the Justice of the said State to John Surand, agent duly appointed to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania; it appearing from authentic documents transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, that the said Daniel Klapp stands charged by the Indictment of a grand jury for the County of Berks in the said State of Pennsylvania, with having committed the crime of fornication and bastardy. — Now, therefore, I George Howard, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State to let the said John Surand agent as aforesaid pass with the said fugitive unobstructed to the said State of Pennsylvania; let the said agent, conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.
