

By the petition of Elizabeth Patterson, and a transcript from the Record of Allegany County Court, it appears that she was fined by the said Court, at October Term 1831, the sum of fifty dollars for retailing liquors without License. The Petitioner states that she is in indigent circumstances, and, in a great measure, depending upon the charity of her neighbors for a support; that she has four children who are young and inexperienced, and if she should be imprisoned for the said fine, there is great danger of their suffering for want of her care and attention; that the circumstances and facts established upon her trial for said offence were not of an aggravated nature, the liquor being sold during her absence and without her knowledge. She, therefore, prays for a remission of the said fine. And two of the Judges of the said Court, having recommended a compliance with her prayer, - we do, hereby, remit the said fine, so far as the same is payable to the State.

By the petition of Richard Simmons, and a transcript from the Record of Montgomery County Court, it appears that he entered into a recognizance with George Green in the sum of fifty dollars, and himself in the sum of thirty dollars for the appearance of the said George Green before the said County Court, at the November Term 1823, and that the said recognizance has since been forfeited. The Petitioner states that he had for a long time understood that the said George Green had appeared as required by the said recognizance, and that he, the said petitioner, was thereby released from all responsibility, and was not aware of his mistake, until the said recognizance was forfeited at March Term 1830; since which period he has used all reasonable exertions to procure the attendance of the said Green, and that at the last November Term the said Green came into the said Court and entered into a new recognizance with security for his appearance to answer the same indictment. - He, therefore, prays for a remission of the said forfeiture. And the Judges of the said Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, - we do, hereby, remit the said forfeiture.
