His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a full and complete Pardon to Alfred Plog, on account of retaking books and merchandise without license, with which he stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of Queen Anne's County. (See Pardon Record).

By the petition of Leonard Coward, and a transcript from the Record of a Montgomery County Court, it appears that he was fined by the said Court, at March Term 1831, the sum of twenty dollars for an assault & battery on George Carey and also the sum of five dollars for an assault & battery on John W. Spate.

The Petitioner states that the punishment given and the fines imposed upon the testimony of the said Carey, and he avers that the affair which led to the said fines was begun by the said Carey, who made an attempt upon his life, by which he, the said Petitioner, was for some weeks confined to his bed, in consequence of the state he received from the said Carey, and rendered wholly incapable of performing any kind of labor for nearly two months. He further states, that he is a poor man with a large and growing family without any other means of support than his daily labor, that he has always through life sustained the character of a peaceable and quiet citizen, and has never been addicted to quarrels, riots or any other course of conduct by which the peace and good order of Society could be
