

March 23^d 1832

His Excellency, the Governor, this day granted the following Pardon
viz.

To Pinkney, on account of Murder; of which he was convicted in
Baltimore County Court, at October Term 1827, and for which he was sentenced to the
Penitentiary for six years. (See Pardon Record)

To William Hughes, on account of Larceny, of which he was
convicted in Baltimore City Court, at November Term 1829, and for which he was
sentenced to the Penitentiary for six years. (See Pardon Record)

March 28^d 1832

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to John
Graves (free negro) on account of receiving stolen goods, knowing them to have
been stolen; of which he was convicted in Kent County Court, at March Term
Instant, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.
(See Pardon Record)

March 30th 1832.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay John
S. Myer or order four hundred and forty eight dollars and seventy cents for one
year ground rent, up to the first day of August next, on Thomas Warehouse
Lots.

March 31 1832

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay J. & B.
J. & B. or order two thousand five hundred and thirty one dollars twenty five
cents for principal and interest of a certificate of stock for two thousand
five hundred dollars, held by them, on account of the purchase money of
Thomas Warehouse Lots.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay George
G. Brewer or order thirty dollars for making Lists of certificates ready for
patent up to the first Instant, made and forwarded to the Commissioner
the Tax of the several Counties, as required by Law.
