

Upon consideration of a Resolution of the last General Assembly
in favour of William C. Conine it was

Resolved, by the Governor and Council, that the Judgment
obtained in Baltimore County Court at May Term 1831, at the suit
of the State of Maryland against William C. Conine, referred to this
Department, he and the same is, hereby, released, upon payment of
the legal costs, and \$150 to Richard W. Gill Deputy Attorney of
the State for his commissions. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
Washington J. Pugh or order one hundred and five dollars seventy one
cent, for repairs to the State House, \$33.34, for taking Inventory of
Arms, and counting and removing knapsacks and canteens, \$28.12, for
Freight on Powder from Baltimore \$15.50, for firing Salute on the
qualification of the Governor, \$8.50, for Hacks for Cannon and carrying
rammers, \$9, for receiving Hallards in the State House, \$1, for Sawings
Arms from the Wharf and Powder to the Magazine, \$4.64, and
for Commission on expenditure, \$5.36, & amount allowed. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
Joseph Wason or order two dollars for trimming the Poplar Trees on
the State House Hill, & amount proved and approved and
paid. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
John Sullivan or order one dollar and fifty cents, for
forwarding the State Flag and fifty cents for carting ammunition to
the Magazine. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
Rebecca Torrish or order one hundred and eighty dollars for six months
pension due her the first instant. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
William Brown, or order one hundred and forty two dollars
ninety three cents, for balance due him in the first instant for one
quarter salary as Major General after deducting the amount of
fees received, as & amount proved. —
