

Saturday April 7 1832
The Council met P M E S E N of the same as on yesterday.

The respective Bonds of David Ricketts and Beale C. Churchman as assistant Inspectors of Flour, being submitted to the board, were examined and approved. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jeremiah Hughes or order, nineteen hundred and four dollars for printing 1000 copies of the Journal of the House of Delegates, including Index, Appendix, &c, under contract with the General Assembly of amount approved and paid. —

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council, draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore in favor of William McNeill, for printing the Journal of Proceedings of the Senate, the amount which may be due him of contract for the said, whenever the same shall be completed. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order two hundred dollars for compensation and expenses for going & exps to Baltimore. —

April 9th 1832
Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Newman or order one hundred and two dollars & sixty cents, for his salary as Treasurer at Easton, from the 23^d of November last to the first instant. —

April 11th 1832
His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a full Pardon to Joseph Jamison, on account of several delinquencies pending against him, since the trial of the County Court, having been removed for trial from the City Court of Baltimore for Libel. —
