suspended by Samuel Stump General Inspector, laid before the board
his answer to the allegations and charges preferred against him by the
said General Inspector: which was read and laid upon the table.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George
W. Purnell or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for and quarter
Salary as a member of the Council due the first instant.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Mary
Young for account of Stealing a Truck and Cart: of which she was convicted in Anne
Arundel County Court, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John
Bacon Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf and
Dumb or order one thousand four hundred and twenty six dollars
and sixty seven cents, for the support, tuition and clothing of Indigent Pupils
from this State, up to the first instant, as provided by Law.

The following Demand was made upon His Excellency the
Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, for the person therein mentioned as
a fugitive from Justice, upon application, and the information and evidence
therein mentioned being deposited in this Department. Viz

To His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the
State of Pennsylvania. Whereas a certain Charles W. Francis,
late of the City of Baltimore, stands charged by the affidavit of Henry
M. Williams of the said City of Baltimore, with having, on the 17th Inst.
feloniously embezzled and stolen Bank Notes and Checks on Banks in
the said City of Baltimore, or the funds drawn for such checks, amounting
to the sum of five hundred and fifty four dollars seventy cents, with which
the said Charles W. Francis (being a clerk for the said Henry
Williams) had been entrusted by the said Williams for deposit in the
Maryland Savings Institution. And whereas information
been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the
Charles W. Francis, has fled from Justice and is now in imprisonment
in Philadelphia. And it being important and highly necessary
the good of Society that the perpetrators of such offenses should be
brought to Justice. Now therefore, I George Wolf Governor
of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority in me vested
