

Communication from His Excellency the Governor to the (Galt  
of the Council stating that in disposition would present his attendance, this  
day was held by the board.

Saturday February 2nd 1833.

The Council met in session  
His Excellency James Thomas Governor  
and  
The Council { Charles Sumner  
                  { Thomas S. Worthington  
                  { John S. Martin  
                  { William Potter

The Council proceeded to the Chamber of the Honble  
Robert W. Bowie, who was confined by indisposition, and on the  
nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the  
advice and consent of the Council, William G. C. Worthington was  
appointed one of the associate Judges of Baltimore City Court since  
William McKee's death and commissions issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the State should pay  
to said W. G. C. Worthington or order thirty five dollars two cents for  
bonding fees for the said day by order of the Executive Council  
passed & passed.

By the petition of Lyman Cook and a transcript from  
the County of Washington County Court it appears that he was fined by  
the said Court a \$100.00 on 11/32/32 the sum of two pounds  
for not appearing and being present without excuse.

The petition represents that he obtained from the Clerk  
of said Court a copy of the same in conjunction with certain Henry Carter  
a person who was named in the said petition and that he had in possession  
of the same and the same required by Law to be taken under the authority  
of the said Court and the Court considering the said Law as not intended  
to impose a penalty on a person found guilty and in fact the money was  
paid to the Clerk of said Court for the said sum required by Law and  
not having in any respect in violation of the said Law but being brought  
under the provisions of the said Law transcending the authority he may  
to be relieved from the said penalty. And the said Court having  
been satisfied of the compliance with the Law of the said person - we  
do hereby remit the said fine as is payable to the State.
