

By the petition of Lloyd Hutton and a return in from the Court of Baltimore County, vizt. it appears that about the year 1830 the said Court in said Lloyd Hutton entered into a Recognizance with Reginald Stevens and did enter a return severally, in the sum of fifty dollars, each to appear before the said County Court to give evidence on behalf of the State against John G. Small on a charge of wilfully and maliciously cutting of the Ear, and striking in the throat & Horse the property of Reginald Stevens; and that the said Recognizance has since been forfeited.

The Petitioner states that he was unable to attend the said Court in consequence of sickness, he therefore prays for a remission of the said forfeiture. And the said Court, and many respectable Citizens having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner. We do hereby remit the said forfeiture.
