

Thursday March 7th 1833.

His Excellency the Governor attended in the Council Chamber and granted a valid discharge to John Coltraw on account of a wound received in the service of his country, and a pension of \$100 per annum by Department of War. (See Record Book)

Friday March 8th 1833.

His Excellency the Governor attended in the Council Chamber and satisfactory information having been received of the death of Peter Bringle Sheriff of Frederick County a commission was issued to Matthew E. Bartow as Sheriff of said County (he being on the return with the said Peter Bringle at the last Election) for the residue of the term the said Peter Bringle died.

Wednesday March 13th 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order for three dollars twenty cents for the purchase of a General to be accounted for.

Thursday March 14th 1833.

His Excellency the Governor attended in the Council Chamber and sent the following message to the General Assembly, by the Clerk of the Council viz
