Saturday April 27<sup>th</sup> 1833

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Bacon Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf and Dumb or to his order one thousand two hundred and thirty dollars eighteen cents for the tuition and support of indigent pupils from the State of Maryland at said institution for 6 months to the first Instant, &c amount.

Friday May 3<sup>rd</sup> 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Simmon or order thirteen dollars fifty cents for six months salary for cleaning the Public Dumps, due the first Instant.

Monday May 6<sup>th</sup> 1833.

The Council met agreeably to public notice.
